Our mission is to collect and provide clothing and other necessities to the homeless and working poor of Northeastern New Jersey and to raise awareness of the plight of the homeless and working poor in this area and beyond.

Heart 'n Hands Mission of St. Timothy Lutheran Church is an Outreach Ministry which provides quality donated clothing and personal care items to the homeless and working poor at five food pantries, soup kitchens and community outreach programs in Paterson, Passaic and Hoboken. We also assist the homeless in Newark, the Broad Street Benches program in Elizabeth, the Light Up Project in Palisades Park, the Church Women United Food Pantry in Irvington, GERA – a refugee assistance program in Paterson, and Catholic Charities Supportive Services for Veterans and their families (SSVF). Located in Wayne, Heart 'n Hands Mission has been assisting people in need since 2010, now reaching more than **5,000** people with our monthly distributions. In addition, we support Wayne Interfaith Network and members of the Wayne community. Heart 'n Hands Mission is 100% volunteer and 100% of all monetary donations go directly to meet the needs of the homeless and working poor.

Stand Down Update

On Saturday, October 12, 2024, the JFK Recreation Center in Newark, New Jersey hosted the Northern NJ Veterans Stand Down event for Essex County. More than 300 Veterans: homeless, at risk and veterans in need of services, attended the Stand Down. Veterans were treated to lunch and had an opportunity to gather information on VA Healthcare, public benefits and housing. Medical screenings, mental health services and legal assistance were also available, as well as the Catholic Charities SSVF (Supportive Services for Veterans and Families) program.

Heart 'n Hands Mission was happy to support our Partner Organization, Catholic Charities SSVF, for their second Stand Down event this year. The Mission provided 300 full size toiletries (shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes with caps, body lotion and soap), 360 t-shirts, 200 pairs of men's and women's underwear, 624 pairs of socks, feminine hygiene products, over 450 dental, shower and shave care kits, and more than 330 protein bars for the Veterans who attended the Stand Down. We thank all of our generous supporters for their donations that helped contribute to the success of this event.

A Mission Moment

possessions outside, I waited at the register. Mike arrived in a few minutes with a few items in his basket, saying, "This is enough for now." He thanked us wholeheartedly, and we left to deliver our purchases to the church.

While at the church we gathered a fleece jacket, a pair of insulated boots, heavy winter socks, protein bars and hand-warmers to take back to Mike. Again, he was grateful, noting that these things would help keep him warm.

I'm relating this as a way to thank all of you for the vital role you play in our ministry. Your donations of used clothing and boots, your monetary donations, many in memory of loved ones, all allowed us to help a person in his time of need in our own community. We often say the Lord works in mysterious ways, but His ways aren't really mysterious after all. Thank you again for helping us provide comfort and care where it is needed.
